2019 Annual Program Report

Introduction

In 2019 1,119 cats and dogs were fixed through Haywood Spay/Neuter. While the number we served was lower than previous years, fewer pets, especially dogs, entered the shelter during 2019. The Haywood County animal shelter intake has been steadily declining along with the euthanasia rate which was a record low of 6%! We believe that our efforts to increase the number of pets that are spayed or neutered in the county has been a prime reason that fewer pets are entering the shelter.

We passionately believe in our mission to provide low-cost spay/neuter surgeries. Working in partnership with the ASPCA Humane Alliance Spay/Neuter Clinic in Asheville, we were able to provide surgeries for 584 owned cats, and 535 dogs this year. Fees for our services were kept at the 2018 rate of \$10 for those clients under 100% of the US Federal Poverty Guidelines: \$20 for those between 100 to 300% of those guidelines and \$60 for all others. Again, 83% of our clients fall below the 300% income poverty guidelines with 41% of those below the 100% level. We do not believe these fees have had a negative effect on the number of clients signing up for transports. In situations of extreme difficulty, we waive these fees. Especially for those clients with many pets. Our priority is always to keep the number of unwanted litters down. Our donors make this possible.

Programs

Spay/Neuter remains our core program that continues to provide low/no cost services in large numbers. Since 2003 we have provided 25,612 spay/neuter surgeries.

Animal Wellness Program was added to our mission statement in 2014. Many of the pets returning from our surgery transports had fleas/ticks marked on their papers. Fleas and ticks were overwhelming in 2019 and we had a hard time keeping up with the demand, BUT we did. Low cost flea, tick, and de-worming medicines are always on hand, and have helped not just the clients going through our spay/neuter program, but all residents of Haywood County.

Also part of our **Wellness Program** is an urgent care fund that is maintained with a local county vet. This veterinary clinic uses the funds on hand to cover the cost of the office visit for those not able to afford this expense and to help towards needed services/medications. The vet that is partnering with us to provide this assistance is effectively determining which client really needs help or not. We are maintaining the data gathered over the last three years which traces medical needs for this pet population. Once analyzed, we plan on submitting it to grantors wishing to promote pet wellness.

Our **Microchip Program** provides low-cost microchips. Microchips are permanent identification (IDs) that can reduce the number of lost pets staying overnight or longer in the shelter. Shelter personnel are required to scan dogs and cats for a microchip at the time of impoundment. When found, officers can call and inform the owner for an immediate and happy reunion. Through grants and donations, we were able to participate at Community Pet Day in the summer giving away over 100 microchips and we offer a free microchip for every spay/neuter surgery.

Our Donors Are Terrific

Although the new 2018 tax laws regarding charitable deductions created some concern, we saw only a small downturn in donations. Most of our donors have been supporting our programs consistently over the years and therefore, we are counting on our donors to stick with us as they have done in the past.

Without our devoted donors' steadfast support, our pet overpopulation problem would be tremendous. It is not bragging to say that the current live release rate of 94% at the Haywood County shelter would not have been possible had the numbers of pets entering the shelter not been reduced.
